

Canine Normal Vitals

Temperature	100.5 to 102.5 degrees
Pulse	60-160 beats per minute
Respiratory Rate	10-30 breaths per minute
Gum Color	<p>Key indicator of health. Moist pink gums are normal. Pale gums indicate compromised circulation, which may mean shock. Deep red gums indicate possible toxicity in their system. Purple to blue gums indicate low oxygen levels or serious internal toxins. Yellow gums may indicate liver problems.</p>
CRT (Capillary Refill Time)	If you press on the gum tissue (mucous membrane should be pink and moist) - it should take less than 2 seconds for the color to return.

Feline Normal Vitals

Temperature	100.5 to 102.5 degrees
Pulse	150-250 beats per minute
Respiratory Rate	15-30 breaths per minute Open mouth breathing is an emergency.
Gum Color	<p>Key indicator of health. Moist pink gums are normal. Pale gums indicate compromised circulation, which may mean shock. Deep red gums indicate possible toxicity in their system. Purple to blue gums indicate low oxygen levels or serious internal toxins. Yellow gums may indicate liver problems.</p>
